



## COLLEGE CREDIT OPPORTUNITIES Bilateral Articulation Agreements

### PLTW Engineering-Berea Midpark

2021 Polaris high school graduates have the opportunity to earn different types of college credits. The specific type outlined below are called Bilateral Articulation Agreements. The agreements are developed by aligning high school CTE and college curriculum. They are developed through a collaborative effort between Polaris Career Center and the listed College or University, who wish to partner. Each articulation agreement option has different requirements. See below for specific information.

#### Who is eligible? *Must meet all requirements.*

1. Students who complete a Polaris program and graduate high school.
2. Students who meet the required expectations listed for the specific agreement.
3. Students who decide to attend the specific institution, offering an agreement.



The chart below shows the current options available for the program.

#### How does the Bilateral Articulation Agreement process work?

1. Students identify the College/University they plan to attend. Students must be admitted prior to completing an agreement form.
2. Students complete an agreement form with the College and Career Coordinator before graduation (*if possible*).  
If a College/University decision is made *after* graduation the student must contact the Coordinator as soon as possible.
3. Polaris will verify the student agreement form and send the form and additional documents per the agreement, to the College/University the student indicated. It is required that forms be sent directly from Polaris to the College/University.
4. The College/University will email students once credit is reviewed and awarded. Students may also ask their College advisor.
